"It gives the full time carers a much needed break and we are encouraging those carers to take full advantage of the government allotted nine weeks respite allowed to them.

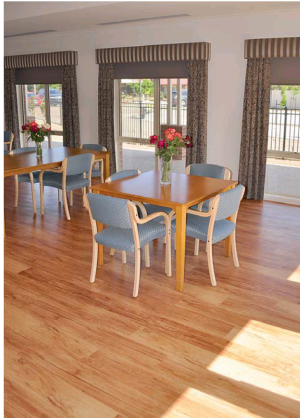
"Woods Point is a Commonwealth funded
