
Weekly Catch Up 13th February 2019 Issue No. 3

With the school year well and truly begun now, we'd like to share a little of our classroom focus at the P-4 Area. Teachers are working to establish 'communities of readers and writers' within their classrooms, setting up the routines and expectations for the Reading and Writing Workshop Model which is the framework for teaching and learning in Literacy.

The Workshop Model is a teaching structure that pushes students to be creative and responsible in their own learning. Reading and Writing Workshop asks students to take charge of their own learning, become active and engaged in their work and develop deeper understanding. Using the workshop model allows teachers to be actively engaged with students individually or with small groups, facilitating and assisting in that understanding, while also providing individualized support. Students who are engaged in the workshop model are actively learning the material and concepts they need to master throughout the year while teachers are able to provide differentiated support and assessment of students individually or in groups.

The Workshop Model begins with a mini-lesson, in which the teacher introduces the Learning Intention for the session, and explores with the children the Success Criteria – How they will know if they have been successful in their learning.

These will be displayed throughout each lesson, explicitly taught and referred to throughout the lesson, and the Success Criteria will be reflected on during debrief time – helping students identify How has this made me a better reader or writer?


